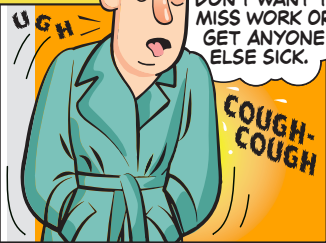


Protect Others from Getting Sick

FROM THE MANAGERS VIEWPOINT:

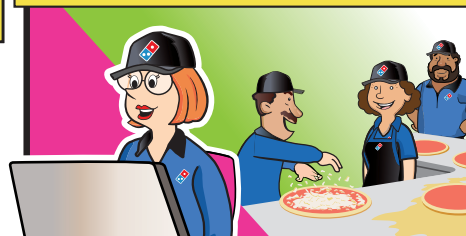

THE MANAGER REFERS TO THEIR STORE'S POLICY ON PREVENTING THE SPREAD OF ILLNESS AND DECIDES THAT IT'S IN THE BEST INTEREST OF THE STORE AND THE TEAM MEMBER FOR THE SICK TEAM MEMBER TO STAY HOME.



MANAGER NOTIFIES THEIR SUPERVISOR TO DISCUSS ANY ACTIONS THAT SHOULD BE TAKEN IN THE STORE, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO SANITIZING THE STORE.
