Jesus calls us to be where he is—near the poor, the sinner, the suffering, and the enemy. That's not just to help them, but to let them help us in ways we never knew we needed.

Baptism is this call in our lives.

Baptism gives us this Spirit to go into the depths and not to stay just on the surface of things. Down into grief. Down into love. Letting go. Unlearning. Baptism shows us who we've always been and who we will always be—a beloved child of an endlessly strong and wise Mother, an endlessly gentle and loving Father.

Baptism brings us back home.

When we are at home in God, we don't even need to be afraid of what we have done or what others have done to us. Need, desire, doubt, resistance, rebellion are no threat either. We can include them. We can include everyone and every thing and exclude nothing and no one.

Because God wastes nothing, not even sin. Because in Christ, all things hold together.

This is the treasure in these waters. This and every other promise of goodness, mercy, and life. You are baptized into the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

We are baptized into the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, and with Christ and all creation, we will forever fall into love and rise to new life. Amen.

FIRST READING: Acts 3:12-19

A reading from Acts.

SECOND READING: 1 John 3:1-7


A reading from 1st John.
