#### THE TRIP

Location: province of San Pedro de Macoris, Dominican Republic Dates: March 10th-19th







We were lucky enough to have Ulrick Gaillard, Founder of the BRA and Maria Virtudes Berroa, help us to arrange our clinic site, as well as in-country accommodation, and transportation.







The BRA is a non-profit organization established 10 years ago to help extinguish the inequities in healthcare and education present in the Bateyes of the DR, where the residents are Haitian in origin and the poorest people living in the DR.







# VOSH continued...



We gave out stickers to the local children. This simple gift of a sticker would brighten up their day.

We examined nearly 1000 patients from the bateyes of Mata Palacio, Morquecho, Casa Colorada, Magua, Monte Coca, Consuelo, Hato Mayor, and Las Pajas.







Following our last day of clinic, a wonderful meal of authentic Dominican cuisine was prepared for us- consisting of goat, fish, chicken, rice & beans and yucca.





Each member was honored with a certificate of recognition for our hard work throughout the week and dedication to patient care. We even got to salsa with some of the locals!

And of course, we got a little down time as well to spend on the beach....





In addition, as a thank-you from the BRA, we enjoyed a day trip to the capital of the Dominican Republic, Santo Domingo.



We dispensed non-prescription sunglasses and artificial tears to nearly every patient as well as prescription glasses to those requiring refractive correction. These included single vision and/or bifocal spectacles for myopia, hyperopia, astigmatism, and presbyopiatotaling nearly 2200 pairs of sunglasses and glasses dispensed for the week!





She finally came back to NECO in January 2007 armed with a cane.

Throughout her illness and amazing recovery, she always stayed positive and kept a smile on her face. She viewed her survival as a second chance at life. Milly, I just wanted to tell you that your bravery is an inspiration to me. Thank you for being such a wonderful friend and person. Even though you will not be walking alongside us at graduation this year, I'm sure I speak for our class as a whole when I say that you will always be considered one of the Class of 2008. With that said, let's go skydiving again!
