
## MESSAGE TO MCO STUDENTS

Your formal education is being consummated during the time of optometry's most dramatic development in stature, in scope and in service. However, in optometric education, as in all other professional disciplines, virtually no one is satisfied that the way in which we are delivering education is as effective as it should be. Much of this dissatisfaction stems from the growing awareness that Lincoln was right when, in the first public utterance, he said, "Education is the most important subject in which we, as a people, can be engaged." Hutchins, perhaps, over-stated the case when he said, "We do not know what education can do for us because we never tried it." It is not an exaggeration to say that no educational program ever delivers fully what it has the potential and the responsibility to deliver. Therefore, students will and should find a climate of change here. This will require that you adjust, but we hope that you will also help guide.

Basic and appliable knowledge in visual science is not the whole of your professional education but rather the framework on which it is based. You must, therefore, achieve a certain level of saturation concerning specific facts, but you should not do this without questioning. Philip Brooks admonished that "Nothing in education is so astonishing as the amount of ignorance it accumulates as inert facts." Nothing assures this ignominious result more than the apathetic swallowing of all "facts" that are served.

If you can fit the events of the days you spend here to industrious and critical inquiry into the body of knowledge that is called visual science, developing thorough competence that justifies self-confidence in your professional skills and molding the qualities of character that make you truly a professional, then our joint enterprise will have approached its potential.




Research with micro-electrode recording commenced this year at the Massachusetts College of Optometry.



Some hope that through this facility we may explore the intricacies of occipital EEG refraction.



















#### On The Nature of Things

On May 6, 1970, the student body of the Massachusetts College of Optometry voted to support a student strike in favor of the following 3 proposals.


1. That the United States Government cease its expansion of the war into Laos and Cambodia; that it unilaterally and immediately withdraw all forces from Southeast Asia.

It is the consensus of this class that our yearbook be committed and dedicated to one common goal:

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
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
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
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
