



IN MEMORIAM DR. JOHN CARTER



Members of The New England College of Optometry and colleagues throughout the country were deeply saddened to learn of the untimely passing of DR. JOHN CARTER, who suffered a heart attack on July 9, 1994 while teaching in South Africa.


Dr. John Carter, Professor of Physiological Optics and Optometry, was a stellar member of the College faculty. He received his O.D. degree from the Pennsylvania College of Optometry in 1953 and was valedictorian of his class. He received his Masters degree in 1959 and Ph.D. degree in Physiological Optics in 1962 from Indiana University.

Prior to beginning his academic career, Professor Carter was in private practice and in the United States Air Force. In 1962, he joined the faculty of the Pennsylvania College of Optometry and came to The New England College of Optometry in 1970. Professor Carter had a long distinguished career in Optometry and Optometric education. He was currently a member of the American Academy of Optometry and served on the Scientist and Educators Admission Subcommittee. He was also a member of the American Optometric Association, the Massachusetts Society of Optometrists, the New England Council of Optometrists, and served on the board of the Bay Point Anterior Segment Symposium, and the editorial board of the NEW ENGLAND JOURNAL OF OPTOMETRY. Professor Carter has also served as President of the National Board of Examiners in Optometry, and had been a member of the Editorial Council of the AMERICAN JOURNAL OF OPTOMETRY, the Optometry Review Committee of HEW, and the NIH Committee for Health Professions Teachers Training Grants. He had been a consultant to the Retinal and Choroidal Diseases Panel, National Advisory Eye Council of NEI, and the Study Section of NIH Short-Term Training Grants of HEW.

Professor Carter's teaching responsibilities included Ocular Pharmacology, Ocular Myology, and Sensory and Motor Anomalies of the Eye and Vision. Those who were fortunate to have been taught by him admired the remarkable depth of knowledge and the dedication and caring that he brought to his students. Professor Carter was honored by the graduating class with the Foster Namias Award for excellence in academic teaching five times in the past seven years. Professor Carter set a standard as an educator and colleague which will serve as the benchmark for others for many years.
