History of the College

To review the development of the New England College of Optometry is to review the development of the profession itself. The New England College of Optometry, founded in 1894, is the oldest continuously operating school of Optometry in the United States. It is an independent, privately funded institution. It is the only Optometry college in New England and approximately 70% of the region's optometrists were educated here. The college has also instituted the largest international optometric program in the world by developing extension programs, the first of their kind, with China, Italy, Spain, and South Africa.

Besides the Doctor of Optometry degree, the college also bestows the Bachelor of Science in Optometry and the honorary degrees of Ocular Science and Doctor of Humane Letters.

Despite the broad changes the college has undergone since its inception in 1894, it still maintains the primary mission of its founder. As expressed in the 1919 catalogue, the college

"aims to give its students a broad and sound training in the science of optometry, a thorough training in the practice of optometry, to uplift the science of optometry to the highest standard, and to make useful, practical and successful optometrists."






















From the Editor
