

The change and rebranding impact the course content and learning experiences.




Research a new LMS or a new way to deliver the course.

Course design

The complication, of course, of the design will slow down the process in the future, especially when we need to scale it.



Research a simpler way to design a course. This is not only good for the early stage of the organization but also convenient for scaling up.

What we have done

We have planned and prepared a set of communication including:

- Recruiting
- Onboarding
- Survey
- Interview Questions

Why we fail to deliver

- **Risk:** The process could only be managed with someone who could follow up and troubleshoot with the learners.
- Vi was not available all the time due to her health situation.
- We could not find a project manager to run the piloting together with Vi.

Collaboration


