


Every reason to lose heart

- 2Cor 1:8-9 utterly burdened beyond our strength, that we despaired of life itself
- 2Cor 1:9 felt that we received the sentence of death
- 2Cor 6:8-10 slandered, dishonoured, treated as imposters, punished.
- 2Cor 11:24-29 lashed, stoned, beaten, dangers, sleepless, hungry, thirsty, daily pressures



Paul But he did not

- 2Cor 5:6, 8 We are always of good courage
- 2 Cor 4:7-9 Not crushed, not driven to despair, not forsaken, not destroyed
- 2Cor 6:9-1- not killed, always rejoicing, possessing everything



Is Paul's Ministry same as my work?

Work is a Ministry

- God worked (Genesis)
- Jesus worked (Carpenter)
- Paul is given the gift of preaching, We are given the gift of work (Ecclesiastes 5:19)
- For one purpose to build up Christ's name

Do not Lose Heart

Observations

- 4. God determines the results


1 Therefore, having this ministry by the mercy of God, we do not lose heart. 2 But we have renounced disgraceful, underhanded ways. We refuse to practice cunning or to tamper with God's word, but by the open statement of the truth we would commend ourselves to everyone's conscience in the sight of God. 3 And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. 4 In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. 5 For what we proclaim is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, with ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. 6 For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

16 So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day.

According to Paul

He does not "lose heart" because:

- He finds sufficiency in Christ
- He views his ministry as a gift of mercy
- He sees himself as a servant of Jesus
- He knows results belong to the Lord



According to Paul

We "lose heart" because:

- Not find our sufficiency in Christ
- Not viewing our vocation as a gift of mercy
- Not seeing ourselves as servants to Jesus
- Not understanding that results belong to the Lord





#1 Sufficiency in Christ Application

- Common sources of false sufficiency 1John 2:16
 - For all that is in the world—the desires of the flesh
 [Lust] and the desires of the eyes [Money] and
 pride of life [Self]—is not from the Father but is from
 the world.
- At least 2 ways this can play out
 - We have made this career choice out of idolatry → so burn out due to no real interest
 - We made this career choice in Christ, but halfway
 we seek these other idols → so burn out because
 we lost sight of Christ
- Q: Where are we finding our sufficiency?



#2 Work is a Gift of Mercy Application

- Due to the fall, work and humans are broken and we tend to not see work as gifts but as:
 - Utilitarian (Ecc 3:9)
 - Meaningless (Ecc 4:8)
 - Robbing of pleasure (Ecc 1:14)
- If we see work as the above 3, it will contribute to us losing heart
- Q: How are we tempted to think about our work?



#3 Work unto the Lord Application

- Plays out in at least 2 ways
 - Work with the Lord as your main paymaster
 - Flee from sin, not just at work but in our lives.
 - Sin leads to burdens emotionally and physically
- Q: How are we tempted to fall into sin as we pursue success at work
 → resulting in extra burdens and stress?



#4 Results are from God Application

- If our reason for burnout is due to the lack of results/ unmet expectations, it can reveal at least 2 things
 - Pride we think we deserve that result
 - Distrust we are not trusting God that he is providing the best for us
- Q: Do we trust in Romans 8:28?


Definition "Losing Heart"

What to do now?

- Symptom burn out
- **Problem** hearts are sick (Her 17:9)
- Investigate word of God (Heb 4:12)
- **Diagnose** word of God (Heb 4:12)
- Treat
 - Go to God, Find ALL sufficiency in Christ
 - Word of God (John 17:17), through His Spirit,
 by His Power
 - Avail yourself to means of Grace Word and Community
 - Take Action (Human responsibility)
 - Steward your body well eat, drink, sleep, rest...
 - Remain in the position you are called with a new perspective
 - Change career
