


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- Pronunciation
- Silent period
 - As with their mother tongue, children begin by observing the language
- Mixing languages is normal

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- Use the new language as much as possible
- Gives children a chance to experience the new language
- Using the language is more important than correct grammar
 - Correction is done through modeling this moves the focus from the wrong answer to getting the message across
 - Making mistakes and experimenting with the language are a natural part of language learning¹
- Repetition
 - We rarely learn anything by hearing it only once however, mechanical repetition is not the goal

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 The easiest way to organize the learning: a daily Moomin Language School time when the children take turns using the learning application while the rest of the group does small-group activities

In our experience, it takes max two weeks for Moomin Language School to become a routine in the organization.

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REMEMBER THE TIME LIMIT

For the best results, the following play times are suggested:

3-4-year-olds: max. 5min/day
5-6-year-olds: max. 10min/day
6+ year-olds: max. 15min/day



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ORGANISING THE PLAYFUL LESSONS

- A big group can be divided
 2 teachers can teach the lesson a
 - 1 teacher can teach the lesson twice
- end of the week
- Most children are present





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SPACE FOR INDIVIDUAL LEARNING

- We recommend reserving a separate space for the daily practice
- Children can concentrate while there is a separate space for individual learning (hearing is an integral part of language learning)
 - Headphones can also help with concentration and hearing
- Keep ergonomic posture in mind



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THINGS TO CONSIDER

- Number of tablets: We suggest having 1 tablet per 5 children.
 Number of children: The ideal group size is 10 children.
- Day for the playful lesson: The important thing is that children practice the topic first in the application, and then have the playful lesson.
