

Transcript Guide

Accreditations:

SUNY Maritime College is accredited by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education (www.msche.org), located at 1007 North Orange Street, 4th Floor, MB #166, Wilmington, DE 19801 (267-284-5011). The Middle States Commission on Higher Education is an institutional accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education and the Council for Higher Education Accreditation. SUNY Maritime College has been accredited since 1952. In addition, SUNY Maritime College's bachelor of engineering programs (electrical, facilities, marine, mechanical and naval architecture) are accredited by ABET (www.abet.org), a non-profit and non-governmental accrediting agency for academic programs in the disciplines of applied science, computing, engineering, and engineering technology. ABET is a recognized accreditor in the United States (U.S.) by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation. SUNY Maritime College's engineering programs have been accredited since 1972, and all five programs since 2009-2010. The International Transportation and Trade (ITT) program at SUNY Maritime College was awarded full accreditation in 2021 by the International Accreditation Council for Business Education (www.iacbe.org), the leading outcomes-based professional accreditation agency for business and management education in colleges and universities whose primary purpose is excellence in teaching and learning. IACBE is located at 11374 Strang Road in Lenexa, Kansas, USA.

Official Semester Grades:

A excellent; A-; B+; B good; B-; C+; C satisfactory; C-; D+; D passed ; F failed; I incomplete; P passed in pass-fail courses only; AP Advanced Placement; TC transfer credit; X exempted; MS no grade recorded; IP is course in progress; W reflects an official withdrawal from the course and is not included in GPA calculations; WF is a withdrawal from the course after the 10th week of the semester and is equivalent to an F in GPA calculations; S satisfactory and U unsatisfactory are used for non-academic courses and not included in GPA calculations. Prior to Spring 2005, there was a J grade, used for a course in which there were extenuating circumstances requiring work being continued into the next semester. Prior to Fall 2003, there were additional grades: E conditional; ED conditional and passed. D or D+ grades may not be issued in STCW Coast Guard license courses, effective Spring 2005. D and D+ are not utilized for graduate courses.

Grade Point Average (GPA):

The GPA is calculated by multiplying the numerical value of a letter grade by the number of credits for the course, yielding the "quality points" for the course, and then taking the sum of the quality points and dividing by the sum of the credits attempted. This process is used both for semester and cumulative GPAs. The numerical values for the letter grades are: A 4; A- 3.667 B+ 3.333; B 3; B- 2.667; C+ 2.333; C 2; C- 1.667; D+ 1.333; D 1; F, WF 0. P, AP, TC are not included in GPA calculation but are included in credits earned. X, W, MS, I, IP, are not included in GPA calculation and are not included in credits earned. E notation to the right of quality points indicates a grade that has been excluded from the GPA calculation; I notation indicates a course that has been repeated with the grade included in the GPA calculation.

Academic Forgiveness

There are certain circumstances in which a student's grade for a course may be "forgiven" i.e., removed from the student's GPA. The course and grade remain on the student's record. Such courses appear on a transcript with E notation next to the grade. In some cases, students may also be granted a "Fresh Start" as a result of a Change of Curriculum (grades for courses not applicable to their new curriculum are forgiven).

Repeated Courses

A student may only receive credit for a successfully completed course only once. If the student repeated a course:

E notation next to grade indicates the course that is no longer being counted in the GPA;

I notation next to grade indicates a course that has been repeated, with the grade for the course included in the GPA.

Degrees Awarded:

Undergraduate degrees are: an Associate in Applied Science, a Bachelor of Engineering, and a Bachelor of Science. Each degree may include various majors; different majors may require different numbers of courses and credits for the degree. To earn an undergraduate degree, a cumulative GPA rounding to at least 2.00 (i.e., $GPA \geq 1.995$ on transcript) is required at the time of graduation. Graduate students earn a Master of Science or Advanced Certificate, which require a cumulative GPA rounding to at least 3.00 (i.e., $GPA \geq 2.995$ on transcript).

Academic Distress and Sanctions:

Each semester, students with a GPA below the required graduation GPA are placed on academic probation for the next semester or are academically disenrolled by the Academic Board. Prior to Fall 2016, students may have also been placed on restricted registration or counsel.

Semester Honors:

Semester honors are awarded for undergraduate students only. In a given semester, the student must have earned a minimum of 14 credits with a semester GPA as follows: for the Admiral's List, the GPA must round to at least 3.50 (i.e., $GPA \geq 3.495$ on transcript); for the Dean's List, the required GPA is 3.00 (i.e., $2.995 \leq GPA \leq 3.494$).

Honors upon Graduation:

There are three undergraduate GPA-based honors awarded at graduation: "Cum Laude" for a cumulative GPA rounding to at least 3.00 (i.e., ≥ 2.995). "Magna Cum Laude" for a cumulative GPA rounding to a 3.50 (i.e., ≥ 3.495). "Summa Cum Laude" for cumulative GPA rounding to a 3.75 or above (i.e., ≥ 3.745). Prior to July 2016, undergraduate students were awarded "With Distinction" for a cumulative GPA of at least 3.00 (i.e., ≥ 2.995) or "With Honors" for a cumulative GPA rounding to at least 3.50 (i.e., ≥ 3.495). For graduate students, the only GPA-based honors at graduation is that of "With Honors" requiring a cumulative GPA rounding to at least 3.75 (i.e., $GPA \geq 3.745$). Prior to July 2016, graduate students awarded "With Honors" required a cumulative GPA rounding to at least 3.80 (i.e., $GPA \geq 3.795$).
