

## Follow-Up on Specific Instance Submission (Oct 15, 2025)

Dear U.S. National Contact Point,

I hope this message finds you well.

This is a follow-up regarding the Specific Instance I submitted on October 15, 2025 (JST), concerning Infroneer Holdings Corporation and its U.S. subsidiary, Maeda America Inc.

I understand that initial evaluations may take time. However, as of today (November 3, 2025 JST), I have not yet received any acknowledgment or auto-reply confirming receipt of the submission.

Given the structural nature and international scope of the case, I would sincerely appreciate a brief confirmation that the materials have been received and are currently under review, especially given the cross-border implications for corporate accountability and whistleblower protection under the OECD framework. This request is made not to expedite any decision, but in the spirit of mutual transparency and good-faith communication, in line with the OECD Guidelines' procedural expectations.

As stated in the OECD Procedural Guidance (Section II.C.3–4):

"NCPs will acknowledge receipt and keep parties informed throughout the process."

In accordance with this standard, I respectfully request a short confirmation that the submission is being considered.

Please also note that if—for any reason—the original message was not successfully delivered due to technical issues, this message should be regarded as a re-sent confirmation request.

As detailed in the submitted materials, the case involves documented institutional failures across multiple domestic channels and falls squarely within the jurisdictional and substantive scope of the OECD Guidelines. Accordingly, a continued lack of procedural acknowledgment may be viewed as a deviation from the Council Recommendations (§ 16 / § 20) and Procedural Guidance (I.C.2 / II.C.3), and could result in a formal communication to the OECD Investment Committee.
