## RadicalxChange Announces First Conference in Detroit

Organized by Economist and Co-Author of Radical Markets, Glen Weyl With Keynote Speech by Co-Founder of Ethereum, Vitalik Buterin



**Detroit, Michigan. March 12, 2019** --- From March 22-24, 2019, RadicalxChange will host its first conference to the College for Creative Studies in Detroit, Michigan. RadicalxChange brings together scholars, artists, technologists, entrepreneurs and activists to imagine, design and build a more humane future where power rests in diverse democratic organizations. Panels, workshops and interactive activities will lead participants over three days to meet each other, brainstorm ideas, and leave with actionable agendas for changing the world.

When describing our movement, Glen Weyl, co-author of Radical Markets and RadicalxChange founder, has said that: "Ultimately, it's syncretic. It's more socialist than the neosocialists are. It has more freedom and free markets, certainly, than the neoreactionaries. By taking the ideas of each of these camps more seriously, we can actually transcend the divisions."

Momentum is building up as RadicalxChange's rapidly growing community heads to Detroit, which was selected to host the conference because of its vibrant artistic history and its legacy as the center of industrial production. Detroit displays both the benefits of conventional institutions when they function and the real costs incurred when they inevitably failed. It is the first major US event of its kind, where academics, activists, artists, policy wonks and technologists can share a path towards addressing the pertinent institutional questions of our times. In an increasingly complex environment, and an increasingly digitized economy, questions of public goods, monopoly power, inequality, and identity have found renewed importance.

Topics to be discussed will be centered around the economy, politics, collective action, use of space and identity. Breakout sessions will be devoted to academic panels, fireside chats, project showcases workshops and discussions. Sample of discussions to be held:

- Radically Reimagining the City, a panel discussion on building charter cities from scratch
- ProjectxChange, a curated event space of projects from members of our community

• Imagining Liberation Through Community, a conversation with Boots Riley, director of *Sorry to Bother You*, on the way film can help can illuminate injustices to the public
