It is now apparently impossible to know what the designer of the notes had in mind or how the words were interpreted by the public. 



Translation of the Völkische Rundschau piece illustrated in this issue:

NON-INTEREST BEARING OBLIGATION FOR FIFTY MARKS. This obligation has been issued for the support and building up of this newspaper. Every note will be redeemed by drawings between May, 1925, and April 30, 1940. The possessor, who must be of Aryan descent, will be paid the face value in full. Notes which have become payable will be announced in this newspaper. Notes which are not redeemed within three months after publication are forfeited to the credit of the newspaper. The Völkische Rundschau is the battle organ of the people's movement. It is committed to freeing Germany from slavery to the French and Jews.

Key to identifying the notes illustrated on following pages: Beverungen 75 Pf. / Beverungen 1 Mark. Brakel 2 Mark / Bremen 2 Mark. Glauchau 3 Mark / Horneburg 75 Pf. Rudolstadt / Tostedt. Sternberg 3x100 Pf. / Brakel 2 Mk. Völkische Rundschau.
