NOTGELD ON THE
MULDE

As has happened to many others, my anticipation of retirement brought out a long list of "things to do." Perhaps ham radio. Or telescopes and astronomy. A couple of college courses. Planting walnuts. Travel, up to six months a year.

Another involved a listing of German rivers, with right bank and left bank towns listed in order. A few samples were even worked out to see if it might be feasible. The idea was broached to a German, and he asked for a copy when it was finished. It sounded as though no one had done the work.

Another idea from pre-retirement was something like THE FRAKTUR. And some walnuts did get planted.

In working with Notgeld, one constantly runs into the suffix following the name of a town /Mulde. How many Notgeld-issuing towns were there with suffix "Mulde?" Why not work in the town-river idea and find out?

Mulde, in the German dictionary, indicates a valley or trough. And it turns out, when the Mulde River is mentioned, it can be one of two branches, which are not normally identified in the Mulde suffix.

We developed 46 Notgeld-issuing towns which stretch along the "Mulde." They are indicated in bold face type on the ensuing pages.

Numismatists, the coin collecting types, often ran into German coins with the Mintmark E, for the Muldenhuette Mint. Try to find that on maps! The town disappeared in about 1953 and melded with Freiberg and the Mint closed. The last Mintmark E appeared on a coin dated 1953. (Please turn to Page 5)

On the preceding pages we listed towns along the Mulde, from the point where it flows into the Elbe River southward to the forks and on to its origins in mountains.

What constitutes a town "along" a river is purely a subjective judgment, and can easily be argued. On the bank? A kilometer away? Two kilometers? Please don't be too harsh. Notgeld-issuing towns are shown in boldface.

River banks are indicated in the direction in which the river flows. Right bank towns are on the right; left bank towns, the left; towns straddling a river are shown in the middle.

Should there be a favorite town along the Mulde about which a reader would like more information, let us know. Or even a request for another river. Remember, we started THE FRAKTUR by traveling up the Rhine River.

WITTEN 1923

Catalogs have long given us information on emergency notes issued in Germany, including date, denomination and perhaps a value.

More curious collectors often wonder about the name of the printer, authority of the issuer, number issued, if any were redeemed, etc. Answers to some of these questions could help determine sale value of the notes.

We are indebted to "Der Bund," published by the Verbandes Grossdeutscher Notgeld-Sammler Vereine, headed by Heinrich Henze, Witten/Ruhr. In the June 1925 issue, second year, number 6, a table was offered of inflation notes of Witten, citing figures of the number issued, number redeemed and the percentage of the redeemed notes to the total issue.

Perhaps a reader with a supercomputer could tell us the total face value of all the issues listed on the table. Remember, the German Milliarde is our billion, and their billion, our trillion.

Accompanying the table was the revelation that from Dec. 21, 1923, counterfeit notes of the last issue of Witten, the 5 billionen notes, began to appear. The banks notified the city, who had issued the notes, and the police.

Notices were carried in the "Wittener Tageblatt," the "Hoerder Volksfreund" and the "Bochumer Volksblatt." A total of 70 counterfeit notes were identified.

In "Das Notgeld der deutschen Inflation 1923," Dr. Arnold Keller listed under 5660f Witten, Handmade fantasy notes dated November 1923 to Jan. 31, 1924, 500 Milliarden notes, with and without a green border; also, dated Nov. 11, 1923, handmade five Billionen notes.

The last day of inflation in Germany was Nov. 19, 1923; at that time the Rentenmark was introduced and limited redemption of inflation notes was available. The redemption figures offered were computed as of April 1, 1924.
