## Ways to Find Employers

- 1 Network for Referrals Develop your network list of family, relatives, friends, neighbors, and other people you know. Ask each for job leads as well for the names of people who might know of job leads.
- 2 **Read and Answer Internet and Newspaper Ads -** Many jobs are advertised on the Internet and in the newspaper. You should answer the ads quickly to be considered for an interview.



- **3 Read and Use the Yellow Pages (Online or Phonebook) -** This is an excellent tool to use. The yellow pages will give you a listing of all the employers in the area as well as a breakdown by specialty areas.
- 4 Go to Job Fairs Job fairs and career days are sponsored by schools, colleges or other organizations. Watch for advertisements about these events.
- 5 **Contact Community Agencies -** There are many community agencies that can help people find jobs. Contact your school, Department of Rehabilitation, State Employment Office, college, or training program for information about agencies that could help you.
- **6** Use the Job Bank at the State Employment Office Use the computerized job bank in the Employment office to see what job opportunities are available. There are also trained employment counselors to help you with your job search.
- Read Trade Magazines and Directories Most industries publish a magazine or journal and a directory of businesses.
  You can find these in the public library or online.
  There are publications for hospitals, stores, banks, hotels and other businesses.
