# Register to Vote

## **TRANSITION OBJECTIVE**

Students will complete a voter registration application.

#### **RELEVANCE TO SUCCESSFUL TRANSITION**

All Americans have the right and privilege to vote. It is critical to exercise this right as a responsible and self-determined citizen.

# **INSTRUCTIONAL SEQUENCE**

#### **STEP 1**: Update Journal

#### STEP 4: Activity - 20 Minutes

Explain that in order to vote in a public election in the community, a person must be 18 years old, a U.S. citizen and registered to vote as a resident of the state. Tell students that voting in a public election is not only a right, it's a responsibility. Explain that there are many adults who do not accept seriously their rights and responsibilities. Ask the class if they have heard anyone talk about doing their civic duty. Explain that voting is a privilege, a duty and a choice. "Who in the room has chosen not to vote in a school or club election?" Discuss with students the concept that in an election their votes count the same as everyone else's.

Students go through the steps to register to vote. Discuss with the class that they are not required to register to vote and if they do, they can still choose not to vote. Voting is one of many choices they will have as an adult.

#### STEP 5: Activity - 25 Minutes

Use voter registration applications from the local Registry of Voters, have students complete the voter registration or go online to the voter registration website and application. Use a copy of the application on a screen image or put the website on the screen to demonstrate for the class. After all applications are completed, issue a classroom **Voter Registration Card** to use for the CCC election.

#### **STEP 6:** Evaluate Outcomes

#### **STEP 7:** Connecting Activity

Students contact the local branch of one of the political parties (Democrat, Republican, Independent, Libertarian) to get sample ballots and campaign information from a current or prior election.
