What Do I Do Now?

Everyone needs help sometimes. Most people are glad to help, too. But people **DO** expect you to try solving problems on your own first. **AND** they need to clearly know what your problem is.

Here's a method for getting help when you need it.

1. Do what you can to solve the problem on your own.
2. If you still need help, choose a person who will know how to help.
3. The person shouldn't be too busy to listen to you.
4. Explain your problem as clearly as you can.
5. Ask them to talk slowly and clearly.
