7 Begin Now to Plan for Your Future Family Life

TRANSITION OBJECTIVE

Students will examine various family life styles and begin planning for the future family they want.

RELEVANCE TO SUCCESSFUL TRANSITION

Students need to begin planning for their future family life by making the right choices now. When they share their thoughts about families they can learn from others and accept responsibility for creating the family they want.

INSTRUCTIONAL SEQUENCE

- **STEP 1: Update Journal** Imagine my family . . .
- **STEP 2:** Convene Roundtable

"My future family will be _____."

□ STEP 3: Advance Organizer

"Today you will develop a collage of American families."

STEP 4: Activity - 10 Minutes

Review the information discussed in the prior lesson about *family*. Have students describe their own families in just a few words. Discuss the changing concept of family in the United States.

STEP 5: Activity - 35 Minutes

Have students work in groups of three to develop a three-minute presentation about family life. The presentation must have a visual component (computer presentation software – e.g., PowerPoint or poster with written and visual images). To prepare for the presentations, go over the **Presentation Outline** to describe expectations for effective speaking and listening skills. Give a copy of the **Presentation Outline** to the students and check for understanding to increase student success. Grades for this activity are based on how closely students follow the outline.



STEP 6: Evaluate Outcomes

STEP 7: Connecting Activity

Have students watch a TV show that involves a family and take notes on their impressions of the family. Stipulate an early evening show that ends before 10:00 p.m.
