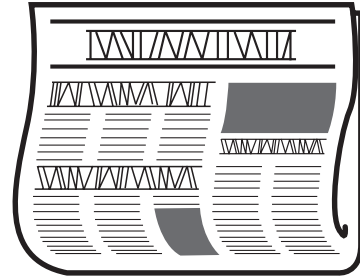


## Use the Newspaper
