Youth 13 and under classes: £10 per class

Youth 14 - 18 classes: £10

Novice Rider classes: £15 per class
Novice Horse classes: £15 per class
Intermediate classes: £15 per class
Amateur classes: £15 per class
Open classes: £15 per class
Championship classes: No fee
Walk/Jog classes: £12 per class
Charity Pleasure class: £10 per entry

Any other classes: £15 per class (unless otherwise specified on the schedule)

Little Britches classes: £5 for all 4 classes, entrants must be current WES members and entered prior to the class, at the show office. There is no requirement to participate in all 4 classes unless competitors wish to. Eligibility for Little Britches classes is confined to children under the age of 10 on 1st January 2025

Jackpot Payback class: £40 per entry See below for full details of this class!

** New Category for 2025 - In Hand Trail **

This class has been added to the Show Schedule for the first time in 2025 For class definition and further details, please refer to the updated WES Rulebook https://wes-uk.com

All competitors must show their horse's passport to the show office, this will enable the horse's age to be verified

Horses aged 3 or under can only compete in Showmanship or In Hand Trail

Horses must be aged 4 or over to compete in WES ridden classes

Walk/Jog classes

Any horse and rider combination that enters a Walk/Jog class must not have gained more than 10 Novice points in that discipline

Any horse/rider combination that enters a Walk/Jog class will **not** be able to enter a standard class which includes loping, in the same discipline

Championship Classes

For the 2025 Show, the first and second placed competitors in that discipline from the Youth 13 & Under, Youth 14 – 18, Intermediate Horse, Amateur and Open classes, will be invited to return to participate in that Championship class.

Competitors who have qualified at WES Approved (Area or Regional) shows will also be eligible to participate, as well as the winners of the 2024 WES Nationals Championship classes.

There will be no separate entry fee for any Championship classes.

Qualifying competitors must ensure they and their horse are competent to perform the manoeuvres required in the Championship classes. Please refer to the WES Rulebook for more information: https://wes-uk.com

** Continuing in 2025 - Jackpot Payback Class **

Following the success of these classes in 2025 we have decided to continue to showcase the skills of some of our best horses and riders by holding a special Versatility class on Saturday afternoon

Entries to this class will be confined to WES members who are already Amateur or Open competitors. We strongly encourage our WES Professionals and other instructors/trainers (as long as you are a WES member) to join in with this class and help us show the best examples of western riding in the pattern on offer

Payback for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in this class Based on a percentage of entry fees

As well as some lovely rosettes and a trophy for the 1st placed competitor

New for 2025 – Inclusion of British Reining classes



At the WES AGM in March, we announced that we were in talks with British Reining to introduce a Joint Membership pilot for Novice riders / Green Reiners and Youths. That has now been agreed and communicated to members.

As a result, WES have agreed to host BR classes at this year's Nationals and in return BR will add appropriate WES classes at the BR Championship Show later in the year.

Please refer to the schedule for details. There is a BR Drug fee is £10 per horse

Please make sure the BR Membership for exhibitor and owner are current and that the horse has the required BR competition Licence. You need to ensure this is updated before the show, online, at the BR website.



WES is an all-breed society and enables its members to compete on any breed of horse which we recognise may have had a totally different "equine career" before moving into western equitation

For 2025 we are very pleased to recognise any members who are competing at the Nationals on retrained racehorses. RoR have kindly sponsored Highest Placed RoR rosettes to the eligible combinations in Novice Horse, Novice Rider, Open and Amateur classes and a prize voucher, Championship sash and rosette to the highest point RoR overall from those four categories.

Competitors with eligible horses will be asked to declare their RoR membership details via the entry JotForm



Non- American Breed Hi Point Award Sponsored by Mick Carder

In recognition of our all-breed philosophy at that all breeds of horses can take part in Western Equitation Mick Carder, Chair of Judges Committee, has generously sponsored a Hi-Point trophy for Non-American Breeds

Competitors with eligible horses will be asked to declare their breed details via the entry JotForm

Area Average Hi Point Challenge £100 for the winning area

The winning area will be able to utilise the funds to support an Area WES approved event, or Area Social event

The Challenge will be based on scores (not placings) from each class and competitors in the 13 areas. Scores will be averaged to decide the winning area.

European Reined Cow Horse Association (ERCHA) classes - explanatory notes

This year we will be offering a special demonstration class in Cutting/Herd Work with explanatory commentary by members of the ERCHA.UK.

Also, on offer will be 2 classes for WES members only, in Cutting/Herd Work. These will be run to ERCHA rules and be judged accordingly. Please see the class schedule for further details.

These classes will take place later on Saturday afternoon to enable our ERCHA.UK colleagues to bring the cattle into the arena and allow them to settle, and for suitable safety barriers to be set up before the 2 WES classes commence.

Closing date for all show entries and stables is Friday 8th August 2025

For all late entries there will be an additional fixed charge. Late entries are any <u>new</u> entries received or made after the closing date (additions and scratches to on time entries are excluded).

Arrival onto showground

Arrival is strictly not before 2.00pm on Thursday 14th August

Stabling

Weekend stable prices: £115 for temporary stables (outside); £135 for indoor stables (19 only available, first booked first served, in order of date/time entries are received. Once fully booked this option will no longer be available. Due to the limited capacity, these stables will only be allocated for use by horses, not to store competitors tack).

Temporary stables for Youth who are attending both the clinic on 14th August *and* will be competing in the show, will benefit from a special concessionary rate of £95/stable for the full duration of the clinic and show.

This concession has been kindly offered by Oakridge Arena.

Duration of show stable hire: Thursday 2.00pm to Sunday afternoon

Temporary stables are provided with 1 bale of straw included in the price; Indoor stables are provided with 1 bale of shavings included in the price. Please advise at time of booking if you do not wish straw/need shavings.

Additional straw/shavings will be available to purchase on site, or you may bring your own.

Stables must be pre-booked by Friday 8th August 2025

Stables are limited so will be allocated on a first come first served basis. Stables will be monitored by the show manager over the weekend. Please ensure stables are left clean and tidy at the end of the show and all used bedding placed on the muckheaps located at the end of each stable run (for temporary stables outside) or as advised by Oakridge staff (for indoor stables). Any competitor failing to leave their stable in a fit state will be charged an additional fee of £20 and may be prevented for entering future shows.

Alternatively, if you wish to have your stable cleared for you at the end of the show, you can add the muck out fee of £20 to your show entry.

WES Travel Subsidy

Any competitor travelling 200 miles or over (one way) will be eligible to have their showbill reduced by £20 per horse. The distance is based on the travel distance from the competitor's home address postcode (as given in their WES membership) to the Oakridge Arena, based on mileage shown in Google maps or a similar on-line platform

Please select the option on the Jotform if you believe you may be eligible for the subsidy and once checked, the Show Office will adjust your final accordingly

Awards

Awards and/or rosettes will be presented to all classes (Rosettes up to a maximum of 6th place) and to Hi Point winners in all divisions

The ERCHA UK special demonstration class will have rosettes awarded to 3rd place All winners may if they choose to purchase a WES engraved buckle at their own expense. Order forms for buckles are available from the Show Secretary

Horse Passports and Vaccination Records

All horse passports and vaccination records must to shown to the Show Secretary before horses are unloaded

The horse passport will confirm the horse's age as WES does not permit horses under 4 years of age to compete in ridden classes

Show Secretary's office

The show office will be open Thursday afternoon (a time will be confirmed in the WhatsApp group) and then 30 mins before the first class and 30 minutes after the last class each show day All show accounts not settled before competitors leave the show ground will incur a £10 surcharge

Electric hook ups MUST BE PRE-BOOKED AND PAID FOR WITH YOUR ENTRY FEE

There are a limited number of these so please book early to avoid disappointment.

The cost is £80 for the duration of the show. Please refer to entry form (JotForm) for day rates.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION for competitors who have booked electric hook ups

You will be provided with a window notice giving your Vehicle Registration number and the dates you have paid for (which for some people may include the Youth Clinic on the day before the show). You must provide your registration number to the Show Secretary at the time of booking.

The notice must be clearly displayed in one of your vehicle's windows at all times in such a way as to clearly visible from the outside, as vehicles will be checked periodically during the show.

WES Admin Fee

£15 for each horse & rider combination

Further information for competitors

- All class entries will <u>strictly</u> close at 4pm the day <u>before</u> the class is due to run.
- Scratches from any classes will be non-refundable once draw lists are posted.
- Entry Fees paid in advance will, if cancelled, be 100% refunded until the closing date of the show. Past closing date only 50% of cancelled entry fees will be refunded upon presentation of a medical or veterinary certificate

- The Show Team request that you enter all the classes that you wish to compete in before the show on the entry form (JotForm), this will enable the Show Team to devise a more accurate timings schedule for the Show
- Any entries received or made after the closing date of 8th August will incur an additional £50 late entry fee applied to the show bill

Stable fees are only refundable if the reserved stable can be rented to another party

The WES Admin charge cannot be refunded

Please be advised we will not accept additional entries made on the gate. All additional entries must be made to the Show Office

Conditions of Entry

- Neither the Western Equestrian Society, Oakridge Arena/Oakridge Quarter Horses, nor the Show Management, shall be held responsible for any loss, damage or expense incurred to any person or horse at the show from whatsoever cause arising. All entries shall be at the sole risk of the competitor
- 2. All objections or complaints must be made in writing to the Show Manager and must be received by them not later than 1 hour after the completion of showing for the day on which the alleged incident occurs, accompanied by a deposit of £10; this will be returned if the objection or complaint is substantiated
- 3. The show organisers, at their own discretion, may at any time before or during the show, reject any entry whether the same has been accepted or not, and their decision in this respect, without giving any reason, shall be final
- 4. No unauthorised person(s) may enter the show ring at any time
- 5. There shall be no return of entries incorrectly submitted
- 6. All entrants into WES classes should be conversant with the rules of the Western Equestrian Society as set down in the current WES Rulebook, available on the WES website, https://wes-uk.com
- 7. Neither the Society nor the organisers will be held responsible for the failure of any competitor in understanding these rules
- 8. Competitors MUST ensure they have adequate Third-Party insurance cover
- 9. Horse riding can be a dangerous sport. Competitors are expected to be responsible at all times
- 10. British Horse Society (BHS) approved hard hats are mandatory for youth competitors under the age of 14, whenever riding or handling a horse. For up-to-date BHS guidance please refer to their website www.bhs.org.uk
- **11.** Youth competitors aged 14 or over may wear western hats (Stetsons) <u>subject to a disclaimer</u> <u>signed by a parent or legal guardian in the Jotform</u>
- 12. Adult riders choosing to ride with a western hat, do so at their own risk, and <u>must sign a disclaimer</u> in the Jotform
- 13. Competitors in the Charity Pleasure or Freestyle Reining class who wish to compete in a costume which does not incorporate either an approved hard hat or a western hat, <u>must sign an additional</u> disclaimer form specifically for this class
- 14. Children must be supervised at all times. Parents or legal guardians of children found not to be supervised and causing inconvenience or hazard, may be asked to leave the show ground
- 15. All dogs must be kept on a lead. DOGS MUST NOT BE ALLOWED TO ROAM FREE ON THE SHOW GROUNDS AT ANY TIME. Please think of others and always clean up after your dog(s)
- 16. **BBQs** are not permitted to be used anywhere on the Oakridge Arena grounds, for reasons of health & safety/fire safety
- 17. **Vehicle parking** all persons who have travelled to the show in a vehicle and parked on the Oakridge Arena site (whether or not you have booked an electric hook up) are to ensure they park their vehicle(s), including any caravans, at a safe distance from each other, to mitigate any risk of spread of fi
